### Dr Milton Lum Siew Wah, FRCOG, FAMB

Dr Milton Lum Siew Wah, a graduate of the University of Malaya, is a practicing Consultant Obstetrician and Gynaecologist. He was the Deputy Chairman of the Malaysian Mental Literacy Movement. He is also a member of the Malaysian Medical Council, the National Patient Safety Council and previously served on the Committee of the Malaysian Society for Quality in Health, the Council of University Tunku Abdul Rahman. He sits on the Board of Governors of Perdana University, and the Board of Directors of Medical Defence Malaysia. Dr Lum had previously served as the President of the Malaysian Medical Association, Federation of Private Medical Practitioners' Associations of Malaysia, Obstetrical and Gynaecological Society of Malaysia and Chairman of the Malaysia Representative Committee of the Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists, Commonwealth Medical Trust. He was the Vice President of the Commonwealth Medical Association and Executive Board Member of the International Federation of Gynaecology and Obstetrics. He was previously FIGO Visiting Professor, Deputy Scribe of the Academy of Medicine of Malaysia, and a member of The Boards of the National Heart Institute and the Social Security Organization. Dr Lum is a regular columnist of The Star newspaper and a reviewer of the International Journal of Gynaecology and Obstetrics and the International Society for Quality in Healthcare. He believes that fairness, transparency and accountability are vital if the Medical Council is to continue to remain fit for purpose.



### Dr Ahmad Razid bin Salleh

Dr Ahmad Razid bin Salleh is currently the Director of Medical Practice Division, Ministry of Health Malaysia, a post which he has held since 2011. He oversees and supervises the implementation and enforcement of the Private Healthcare Facilities and Services Act 1998 (Act 586) and its Regulations 2006 covering aspects of regulation and monitoring of the private healthcare facilities and services involving licensing of healthcare facilities, registration of private clinics (medical and dental) throughout the country based on the standards set in the Act 586 and its Regulations. These include the implementation of the quality assurance activities with emphasis on patient safety and quality of care. He was also involved in activities involving medical legislation in terms of establishing new medical related laws such as organ transplant and assisted reproductive technology; and supervising Medico Legal Section that handles medico legal issues and complaints. He coordinates the administrative function of the Malaysian Optic Council and the Medical Assistants Board.

Dr Razid graduated from the University of Malaya and holds a postgraduate degree in Masters of Public Health with speciality in Epidemiology from the National University Malaysia. His area of interest includes healthcare services law and he has obtained a Bachelor of Legal Studies, BLS (Hons) from MARA University of Technology.
